- I. Call to Order The meeting was called to order at 10:03 A.M. by Mr. Rice
- **II. Introductions** All members introduced themselves.
- III. Approval of October 3, 2019 Meeting Minutes Ms. LaPaglia noted one misspelled name on the guest present for the last meeting. Ms. Parks motioned to approve the October 3, 2019 meeting minutes with the change noted. Ms. LaPaglia seconded; motion carried.
- **IV. Financial Report** Mr. Sheridan directed the board's attention to pages 5 27 of the packet to review the financial report. The FY2019 financial report shows a zero balance in all categories. All funds have been utilized and payments have cleared. The unrestricted fund shows some fluctuations due to BVWACs and insurance payments but also a big increase due to the Stroke Symposium. The supporting documents detail all expenses and checks paid throughout the grant year.

The FY2020 financial report shows expenses for salary and taxes. There are two pending expenses that will be in the system for the next report to include GETAC travel reimbursement for Ms. Parks and EMS County reimbursement for Washington County EMS.

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Funds have been earmarked for the following events/expenses:

- \$2,700 Active Shooter Presentation in Brenham
- \$2,000 EMS Conference registration and travel expenses for two College Station EMTs that won the SIM competition

Ms. Lugar motioned to approve the financial report as presented. Mr. Deramus seconded; motion carried.

#### V. Executive Directors Report

- A. SB 500 Update Ms. Parks shared that Senate Bill 500 gave \$2 million to RAC chairs to spend. The decision was made to spend the money as a group instead of dividing it up to show appreciation and collaboration between the RACs. Ms. Parks directed the board's attention to page 28 of the packet to see the options being discussed and voted on for how to use the funding. Mr. Sheridan displayed an email that listed the collaborative efforts discussed across the state to include:
  - Patient Wristbands in the Field
  - Whole Blood
  - Statewide Patient Tracking System
  - Burn Surge Management Plan
  - Falls the #1 Cause of Traumatic Injury
  - Mobile Dialysis
  - Bystander Basic Training

What the board needs to consider is what would most benefit our region moving forward. There are phone calls every other day regarding this funding and many calls occur where no action is taken. The members present discussed the merits and hurdles of each of the proposed efforts. Mr. Sheridan asked the members present to identify the projects that are most favorable for the region. Members present voted on the projects and the Patient Wristbands and Whole Blood were the top two projects selected by the board.

- **B. BVRAC EMS-RAC Final Narrative** The final narrative was submitted to the state in October. The narrative included information from discussions at meetings. All items were either met or had significant activity.
- **C. BVRAC EMS-RAC Goals and Objectives –** Mr. Sheridan shared the proposed goals and objectives for the current year and asked if they should mirror the goals and objectives from last year. The current objectives are broad and do not have specific numbers. The group present elected to keep the objectives broad. The

objectives include continuing the symposium and training opportunities to the participating agencies, trauma systems plan, stop the bleed courses, sepsis study and Systems QI training. The members present agreed to keep the symposium, training opportunities, trauma systems plan and stop the bleed objectives as is.

The objectives Sepsis study is on the list and members discussed the benefits of having a Sepsis activation plan as a region so hospitals could be contacted to address needs of a patient. There is a lot of information hospitals can get from a regulatory standpoint from an EMS record. The end goal of the project could be EMS protocols for a sepsis activation. Mr. Deramus added that the initiative needed to come from the hospital end.

Systems QI is a continuing objective to include case studies and training for the membership. Mr. Deramus suggested that physicians get together to do chart reviews once a year, possibly at the symposium, to address systems QI. Ms. Parks and Ms. Lugar shared concerns that it would take more than one day and it may need to be done semi-annually or quarterly. Ms. LaPaglia suggested that there be an escalation process where the board reviews the charts and determines which ones should be reviewed by the physicians group.

Ms. Parks pointed out that the information reported for Systems QI needs to be reviewed and revised. It is a time consuming report that may not always have a purpose. Need to add sepsis, stroke and other critical information. The data should also be shared among facilities.

Mr. Sheridan shared that the case studies and training at General Assembly should continue and the physicians meeting can be set up for additional Systems QI efforts.

Mr. Sheridan asked for additional goals and objectives for the region. Dr. Dawson shared that the perinatal group would be reviewing and developing a transport plan with Ms. Elmore with CATRAC. Mr. Sheridan encouraged the board to think about and share any other goals or objectives at the next board meeting. The end result will have to go before the General Assembly for review and approval.

#### VI. Discussion and/or Action Items

- A. Consider for approval BVRAC Membership tracking align with fiscal calendar Ms. Lugar made a motion to align BVRAC Membership tracking with the fiscal calendar. Mr. Deramus seconded; motion carried.
- B. Consider for approval STJEMS adding up to (50) radios onto the BVRAC's BVWAC 700/800 system count CHI St. Joseph EMS may be adding approximately 50 radios to the BVWACs system. Mr. Matthews made a motion to

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approve the addition of up to 50 radios from STJEMS to the BVRAC BVWAC 700/800 system count. Mr. Deramus seconded; motion carried.

#### VII. Committee Reports

**A.** Education (Roger Sheridan for Ashley Kopech) – Mr. Sheridan directed the board's attention to page 35 of the packet to see that over 1,300 students and 138 instructors were trained in stop the bleed in the month of October. There have been several classes held in Robertson and Grimes County so far in November.

Ms. Johse shared that there are stop the bleed classes scheduled on the following dates:

- November 13<sup>th</sup> at College View High School
- December 11<sup>th</sup> at Bryan High School
- January 22<sup>nd</sup> at A&M Consolidated High School

Schools are requesting kits and the policy is that they are only provided if RAC personnel provide training at the school. Ms. Parks informed the board that schools have been awarded \$9/kid for disaster management. Schools will need to plan to purchase their own training kits for the required annual training. Ms. Johse anticipates one more year of purchasing stop the bleed kits with a focus on smaller districts. Mr. Sheridan requested the number of kits needed so the order can be placed.

- **B. Pre-Hospital (Kevin Deramus)** Active Shooter course is on November 19<sup>th</sup> in Brenham and 93 have registered so far.
- C. Hospital Care and Management / Acute Care (Erin Gaas) The Save the Date cards for the symposium has been created and sent to Wanda in the El Paso RAC for approval. The hope is to share it at GETAC and other events in the coming months. The first speaker for the symposium, Tanya Glen, has been booked and others are being pursued.

Mr. Rice shared a new project idea with the board. When you have a super sick, top tier level critical trauma patient a mile away from the hospital, how do you send information through the system to have the correct people meeting EMS at the ER? One possible solution to this is a standardized EMS Radio Report that is used every single time. The paramedic does not want to get on the radio to talk to the ER because they do not have the answers to the questions that the ER nurse has. The standardized report would help everyone know what information they are going to get and in what order as they go down the form. Ms. LaPaglia offered to go to the

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ERs and ask what information they need to see on the report and will report information at the next General Assembly.

Mr. Deramus shared that Scott & White College Station refuses to use the radio. It makes it hard for agencies bringing patients in to the facility, especially the flight crew.

- **D.** Stroke (Rebecca Hickman) Information provided in earlier report
- E. System QI / Physicians Advisory (Dr. Vincent Ohaju / Wanda Dias) No report.
- **F.** Injury Prevention (Ashley Johse) Information provided in earlier report.
- **G.** Disaster / Emergency Preparedness (Corey Matthews) Point of Dispensing at the Brazos Center this Saturday, November 9<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am with 200 flu shots. Leon County is bringing their MMU.

Mr. Sheridan shared that there are 50 pink vests remaining for nursing home evacuations. Please let him know if any facilities in your area need more vests.

There are seven casualty trauma kits with triage tags in Mr. Sheridan's office. Mr. Sheridan asked if they should they go out to EMS agencies or be kept at the office? The decision was to have them out in the field and Mr. Matthews offered to pick them up.

**H. Perinatal (Dr. Daniel Dawson)** – The perinatal committee made the final decisions on what to purchase with the hospital preparedness funds and facilities will be getting sleds and inserts for use during evacuation. Training will be provided to each facility.

#### VIII. Open Forum

• Mr. Matthews shared that CHI was approved for money for radios through the Hospital Preparedness committee with last years' funding. The vendor originally said they would match the price paid for the counterfeit radios. The quote has come back with a price increase of over two and a half times the original price. May need to look at some funding from BVRAC and current year HPP budget to cover the extra \$12,000 expense.
