- **I.** Call to Order The meeting was called to order at 9:31 A.M. by Mr. Rice.
- **II. Introductions** All members introduced themselves.
- III. Approval of September 11, 2020 Meeting Minutes –Mr. Deramus motioned to approve the September 11, 2020 meeting minutes. Ms. Parks seconded; motion carried.
- **IV. Financial Report** Mr. Sheridan directed the board's attention to pages 5 15 of the packet to review the financial report. BVRAC achieved a zero balance on all contracts for the last fiscal year. The report shows that there have been no significant changes since the last Board meeting. The only charges include salaries and benefits for Mr. Sheridan and Ms. Hill. At the last board meeting, members present discussed moving all committee funding to education or injury prevention to support the purchase of more decontamination units, decon solution, a small Stop the Bleed Kit for Brenham Scott & White and keeping \$10,000 available in education for reimbursement of training expenses.

Request form and payment information from one agency is needed to finalize the EMS County I funds and open the EMS County II funds. Requests must be submitted by June 1st for EMS County II funds.

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The budget shows \$7,000 is allocated to the BVWACS radio invoice. There is an action item to increase this amount to \$9,500 to cover the additional radios added to the system.

The unrestricted budget shows no significant changes. Membership invoices were sent out this week to all agencies.

Ms. Brooks motioned to approve the financial report as presented. Ms. Kopech seconded; motion carried.

	The delay in surveys has allowed the designation staff to focus on application reviews and designation determinations. The maternal designations will be close to 50 in the next 6-8 weeks with more to follow. We have currently received 75 applications, which is approximately 33% of facilities currently offering maternal services. The deadline for designation is August 31, 2021. All facility surveys need to be completed prior to April 1, 2021. All applications need to be submitted prior to May 1, 2021. We would like to avoid mass submission of applications at the last minute if possible.								

Designation Programs continued

The disaster response and health concerns caused many of our facilities to postpone or cancel their on-site surveys, not only in the recent months but through the end of the year:

Trauma – 32 Stroke – 34 Maternal – 14 Neonatal – 2

Several facilities were able to reschedule their surveys for a later date. One survey organization was able to continue some of their on-site surveys safely during this time.

Due to the current situation the survey organizations brought forth the idea of virtual surveys to the program for consideration. The program has worked closely with the survey organizations in the past few months to standardize the virtual survey process. The virtual survey guidelines for survey organizations is included in this meeting's documents for your review. We will also be distributing these guidelines to THA, TORCH and any other pertinent stakeholders. The perinatal survey organizations have all performed survey functions virtually or full survey virtually. DSHS has observed the virtual surveys and are providing feedback to the organizations to ensure the process is consistent and the integrity of the process is maintained. There have been challenges with every new process, but overall the surveys have been going well. The virtual guidelines will apply to all survey organizations. They were reviewed by multiple survey organizations including the ACS. DSHS wants to ensure that all survey organizations are evaluating facility programs consistently with the requirements.

Stroke survey organizations are performing a virtual abbreviated survey process with facilities. If a facility is expiring and receives an abbreviated survey process, this report will be accepted, and the facility provided with a contingency survey until a complete survey can be conducted. So, you will see an increase in contingency designations for stroke facilities on the website.

Due to the postponement of surveys, Trauma, Stroke and Neonatal facilities may apply for a designation expiration extension. The facility administration will submit a request for

an extension. The extension is for 90 days and will be approved for an additional 90 days **Designation Programs** continued when needed. We only ask that the program manager communicate with our designation coordinators to keep us updated. Trauma and neonatal designations will continue under and extension. DSHS is working with them to ensure eligibility for Medicaid and UCC funding. We will be developing guidance documents for each designation program. The guidelines will assist facilities and surveyors on how to meet compliance with each requirement. They will be straight forward and consistent. The trauma guidance document will be released in approximately two weeks. Designation is adhering to the rules in requiring Trauma and Stroke applications to be submitted 1 year prior to expiration. We have not experienced any difficulty in receiving the RAC participation letters at this time. Currently, there is no change in this process for designation applications. DSHS Update: Robert Friedrich, Program Specialist Rules The Stroke Facility Designation Rule, 157.133 and Trauma Service Areas, 157.122 will go to the November GETAC Council Meeting. We plan to send these rules to the Rules Coordination Office (RCO) in December to begin the internal process and have a Proposed Rule Packet by February 2021. The Funding Rules, 157.130, EMS and Trauma Care System Account and 157.131, Designated Trauma Facility and Emergency Medical Services Account, and the Regional

Advisory Councils (RACs), 157.122 are in the internal process within EMS Trauma Systems.

The Neonatal Designation Rules 133.181 – 133.190 are currently being reviewed by the Perinatal Advisory Council (PAC). Their next scheduled meeting is November 17, 2020, 10:30 AM. If there are any edits, suggestions, concerns, please communicate those to the PAC.

Rules Elizabeth Stevenson and Jorie Klein are working on the rule resource document and a continued companion rule guidance document for 157.125, Trauma Facility Designation. Question on when the companion guidance document for the Trauma rule would be available: o Jorie Klein, RN, Director, advised that it is near completion and plans to have it available within a couple of weeks. We will also plan to have similar documents for Neonatal, Maternal, and Stroke Designation. Work continues on the review of the current EMS rules. A new EMS attorney started on October 1st, 2020, so internal meetings will begin again. Hopefully there will be some stakeholder meeting (webinars) over the winter to start gathering input on the first draft of the document. Before starting the official rule process there will be many opportunities for stakeholder review and input. The formal process is not expected to start before fall of 2021. Jorie Klein, RN, Director, reported there will be a questionnaire based on the American College of Surgeons (ACS) assessment of the Texas Trauma Systems that will be sent to the RACs.
