- I. Call to Order** – The meeting was called to order at 10:00 A.M. by Chairperson Parks.
- II. Introductions** – All members introduced themselves.
- III. Approval of December 5, 2024 Meeting Minutes** - Members present reviewed the December 5, 2024 meeting minutes. Ms. Johse made a motion to approve the December 5, 2024 minutes. Ms. Porter seconded; motion carried.
- IV. Financial Report** – Chairperson Parks directed the board members’ attention to page 6 of the packet for the financial report. The overall budget is the first one. The next is the RAC Systems Development budget and the only amounts taken out of that one are for travel reimbursements to Chairperson Parks and Mr. Giles for participation in the RAC Summit in December. Committees with allocations need to decide what to spend their funds on by May

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31st to allow adequate time to get things processed. Then any necessary changes to the budget can be made at the June meeting. Eighty percent of the EMS RAC budget remains.

The Amendment 2 budget shows everyone's allocations. Receipts and quotes need to be sent to Mr. Heritage to request these funds and get the budget spent before the August 31st deadline. Robertson County EMS has requested and received some of their allocation and College Station is in process to get some of theirs.

College Station Fire is still the only EMS Agency that has requested EMS County funds. Other agencies need to get requests submitted.

All funds have been requested with the Senate Bill 8 contract. BVRAC received about \$373,000 which was bumped up to \$395,000 with funds from other RACs across the state. The funds provided tuition support for 79 individuals. There is one final payment for \$16,000 that has to be processed, which is the last of the funds. There are eight individuals that owe money back to the state for payments made with Senate Bill 8 funds. These individuals have received at least two notices so far. The deadline to pay is July 31st.

For the unrestricted budget you can see the only expense is the December lunch for General Assembly at \$1,217..

Ms. Johse made a motion to approve the financial report as presented. Ms. Mendoza seconded; motion carried.

- V. Stroke Committee Report** – The Stroke Committee report was given early to allow Ms. Plotts to give an update before she had to leave. There was a stroke committee meeting this week. Ms. Reed is co-chairing the committee. The group decided to continue the VAN tracking form. The transfer times for LVO patients will be added. A workgroup will look at ways to improve the data collection tool Ms. Plotts asked to be on the next Pre-Hospital Committee meeting agenda to discuss this as well. Someone from the region will be present at the Stroke GETAC meetings moving forward. The committee also discussed how to spend the \$1,000 available. The idea of a community walk came up that would promote both cardiac and stroke awareness as well as BVRAC. There are some issues with readmission and this would help get the word out on symptoms and risk factors. The committee will meet monthly. The group talked briefly about cardiac and will be looking at what the focus of the state is. One area is delay and transfer to STEMI receiving facilities which includes transferring understanding what the requirements are. The goal for this committee is to be active and get some things accomplished in the region in 2025.
- VI. Executive Directors Report:** No report
- VII. State RAC Chair / ED Meeting Update** (Chairperson Patti Parks) – Chairperson Parks and Mr. Giles attended the RAC Summit. A few key notes from that include

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- A. RAC Attendance – We must keep up with attendance and ensure everyone is participating that needs to be.
 - B. Inventory – We are responsible for all items purchased until they reach the end of life. Please make sure any asset tags that you received are placed onto the purchased equipment.
 - C. Door in to Door Out times for unstable traumas or multi-injury traumas. Fifty percent across the state are meeting less than 120 minutes.
 - D. Door to needle for thrombolytic and stroke patients. The median time is now 39 minutes.
 - E. Use of Stroke Scale by EMS which is at 47.2%
 - F. Pediatric Readiness – Average score is 73% across the state
- There is talk of a statewide database for perinatal data. The Perinatal Committee is already collecting a lot of the data they are looking at having in the database.

VIII. Discussion and/or Action Items -

- A. **Consider for approval amending the RAC’s Tax Reporting Year to the Effective Period of 10/1/YYYY to 9/30/YYYY**– The board discussed changing the BVRAC tax reporting year during the last meeting. This change will make the financial reporting easier. Ms. Mendoza made a motion to change the RAC’s Tax Reporting Year to the Effective Period of 10/1/YYYY to 9/30/YYYY. Ms. Johse seconded; motion carried.
- B. **Discussion on RAC Reporting Requirement for Hospital Data** – DSHS sent an email to RAC Directors that the RACs would be tracking six different metrics from hospitals on a quarterly basis. The displayed spreadsheet shows the different metrics that are involved. This requirement is not in the contract or other documents. Mr. Heritage will send out an email and calendar invite with the information. The facilities will just need to fill out their name and fill in the numbers for each metrics. Ms. Mendoza asked about the time frame for these metrics. Mr. Heritage has not heard back from the state for clarification on that but the plan is to do the end of the month as the reporting date.
- C. **Consider for Approval a Budget Amendment to Amendment 2 Budget** – Caprock is no longer in operation in the region and had an allocation in the Amendment 2 budget. The proposed action is to take the unused allocation and divide it among the other facilities. Mr. Giles mad a motion to accept the budget amendment as presented. Ms. Johse seconded; motion carried.
- D. **Discussion of Pulsara** – No action

IX. Committee Reports

- A. **Education (Brandi Mendoza for Adam Gallagher)** – Mr. Gallagher has been working on getting the FCCS course set up. He is also working on the logistics for some people locally to become instructors so we can save money in the future. There will also be an FTEP course. Chairperson Parks shared that Mr. Heritage will be keeping track of education provided in the region and to individuals in the region.

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We will be tracking the cost and how many people are participating. There are some NRP classes scheduled for later in January as well.

Chairperson Parks asked if there is a need for ACLS courses in the region. The RAC has mannequins and other materials that could be put to good use with that.

- B. Pre-Hospital** (Kevin Deramus) – No Report
- C. Hospital Care and Management / Acute Care / Special Populations** (Lori Porter) – No Report
- D. System QI / Physician’s Advisory** (Amber Heredia) – Physicians will be getting together in March. The Trauma Medical Directors will also review the Trauma Systems Plan when that is ready.
- E. Injury Prevention** (Vacant) – There were a lot of people certified as CarFit technicians in December.
- F. Disaster/Emergency Preparedness** (Bruan Ruemke) – No Report
- G. Perinatal** (Dr. Brading) – No Report.

- X. Open Forum** – Mr. Heritage received some hospital trauma data from the state. The information will be sent out to everyone. There is also some data for EMS agencies

Board members discussed the location for the next Symposium. The Brazos Center did have issues this year but it is a centrally located option. TEEX has also mentioned that they may be able to host the symposium.

Ms. Heredia will have a presentation on hypothermia and temperature. Baylor Scott & White will also have a small presentation for the February General Assembly.
