A BRIEF STORY ABOUT US

The Brazos Valley Regional Advisory Council (BVRAC) was created in 1993. As part of Texas' regional trauma system development, the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) established Regional Advisory Councils (RACs) to coordinate trauma and emergency healthcare services across the state. BVRAC serves Trauma Service Area N (TSA-N), covering the Brazos Valley region. BVRAC helps to manage regional healthcare planning, training, and funding for trauma and emergency medical services. BVRAC also oversees various initiatives such as injury prevention, disaster emergency preparedness, and continuing education for healthcare professionals.



VISION



The BVRAC mission is to take an ecological and multidisciplinary approach to the emergency medical system by unifying the Brazos Valley Region through public health, emergency management, injury prevention, acute care, and emergency services. BVRAC plans to engage the RAC members, all trauma physicians, nurses, and emergency medical technicians, along with anyone involved in emergency/trauma response to positively affect the knowledge and skills of the Brazos Valley community so that it can make health related gains before, during, and following emergency situations and trauma incidents.

The overarching goal is to provide comprehensive trauma care through strong partnerships, acute care via rapid response, and injury prevention by means of education, and innovative programming. We believe that a dedication to unity, special at-risk populations, and outreach education will continue to catapult not only the BVRAC, but most importantly, the entire region into another level of service, trauma response, and prevention.



INJURY PREVENTION COMMITTEE

The Injury Prevention committee is tasked with providing statistics and guidance within TSA-N for injury prevention activities. In 2024, the Injury Prevention committee held 5 Stop the Bleed (STB) classes across the region. In total, over 400 citizens received this life-saving training.

FALL PREVENTION OUTREACH

In 2023, falls were the highest reported mechanism of injury within TSA-N across all age groups.. To spread awareness of the impact of falls and increase public knowledge of ways to prevent this injury type, BVRAC's Injury Prevention committee partnered with KBTX Media through a month-long public outreach campaign geared towards fall prevention.


The Education committee is tasked with providing guidance for training within the region to enhance trauma and acute care standards. BVRAC provided funding for the following projects:

STROKE/CARDIAC COMMITTEE

The Stroke/Cardiac committee is tasked with providing community stroke/cardiac education, developing transport plans consistent with GETAC guidelines, and developing system performance improvement initiatives. BVRAC provided funding for the following project:

F.A.S.T Magnets

Stroke is the No. 5 cause of death and a leading cause of disability in the United States. By sharing the F.A.S.T. warning signs, BVRAC is helping to spread public awareness about the signs of stroke.

BVRAC purchased 650 F.A.S.T. magnets which were then placed at hospitals across the region for patients and visitors to take home and reference as a guide for signs of stroke.



PERINATAL COMMITTEE

The Perinatal committee is tasked with developing initiatives to improve the quality of healthcare, access to care, and education for pregnant women and newborns in the region utilizing best practices and evidence based medicine. BVRAC provided funding for the following project:

Preeclampsia Magnets

BVRAC purchased 550 Preeclampsia awareness magnets which were then placed at hospitals across the region for patients and visitors to take home and reference as a guide for signs of this condition.

Infant Evacuation Baskets

BVRAC purchased multiple Evacuation Baskets with 02 Backpacks which can be utilized for evacuation of high risk and NICU infants. The backpack goes over the shoulders allowing for hands free carrying of the basket.

The Disaster/Emergency Preparedness committee is tasked with coordinating preparedness and responses to acute medical mass casualty, evacuation, and disaster situations



Systems QI & Physicians Advisory Committee

The Systems QI & Physicians Advisory Committee is tasked with ensuring optimal care of the trauma and acute care patients in TSA-N through critical reivew of select cases by members of BVRAC, collecting data of patients transferred out of the region, monitoring the performance of identified performance improvement indicators, and making recommendations regarding system enhancement and/or improvements.




Acute Care & Hospital Management Committee








EMS COUNTY

- EMS Communication Systems


In **2024**, BVRAC passed-through **\$86,652.00** from this category to the following EMS providers:



2023 HOSPITAL TRAUMA DATA


